Dear Parents of Students in Grades 2-8,

As noted in the Family Handbook, students are responsible for the care of their chrome books. The insurance you paid on Orientation Day covers drops, water damage, normal wear and tear, and hardware failure. The insurance will not cover lost or stolen devices, the AC adaptor, or the battery. The school will replace the batteries if needed. Please discuss with your child the importance of taking proper care of the chrome book. Replacement of lost, stolen, or abused devices is the responsibility of the parent.

When a student notifies the staff regarding a repair issue, an extra chrome book will be issued to your child (if one is available) until the repair is made, usually 7-10 days.

Chrome books are intended for school work use ONLY. If a child is found to have used the chrome book for any other purposes, he/she will be denied access to it for a period of time.

If your child (gr. 3-8 only) needs to bring the chrome book home for school use, it will be allowed with your written permission. Again, it may only be used for school work. There isn't any school work that needs to be specifically done on the chrome book. Home computers can be used to access all school work if you do not want your child to bring home the device.

If you grant permission, however, your child must sign out the chrome book with his/her teacher at the end of the day.

Questions about the chrome books can be directed to any teacher or me.
