NOTES AND EVENTS

Dear Parents:

Have you ever heard of the summer backslide? Research has shown that children lose some of their reading and writing abilities over the summer. They return in the fall and many must re-learn some of the basic skills to move onto grade level requirements. Research done by **Kim and White (2011)** show that **fourth grade students who read 5-8 books over the summer gained 80 lexile's while students who read 1 or no books lost 50 lexile's.**

I attended a conference featuring Pam Allyn. Pam is an author (Every Child a Super Reader), and an advocate for Literacy for children. She is the founding director of LitWorld, a global literacy initiative. LitWorld and Scholastic have teamed up a created LitCamp, a summer literacy program.

I am excited to announce that I would like to run a Litcamp here at Divine Savior this summer. The Camp is a 4-week program. This Camp is intended for children of all reading abilities. The 2 ½ hour day would start with a 15 min. Welcome/Opening, next 25min.Read aloud, then 20 min. to bring

text to life (acting, puppets), followed by 25 min. talking about the story elements, then 20 min.

independent reading, next 15 Snapshot play (listening games), of course 15min. for writing power,

ending with Closing campfire ☺).

- This is a Monday thru Friday week
- The camp would run from July 15th through August 9th.
- Grades K -2nd would run 9:00 to 11:30 (limit 8 students 1st come 1st served)
- Grades 3rd – 5th would run 12:30 – 3:00 (limit 10 students 1st come 1st served)
- Cost is \$150 for the program and is due when registering. A refund will be given if I do not get a minimum of 5 for the morning AND 5 for the afternoon.
- Sorry there is no daily rate, so a refund will not be given for any missed days.
- Registration due: Wednesday, April 17th (sorry for the quick date, materials must be ordered soon)
