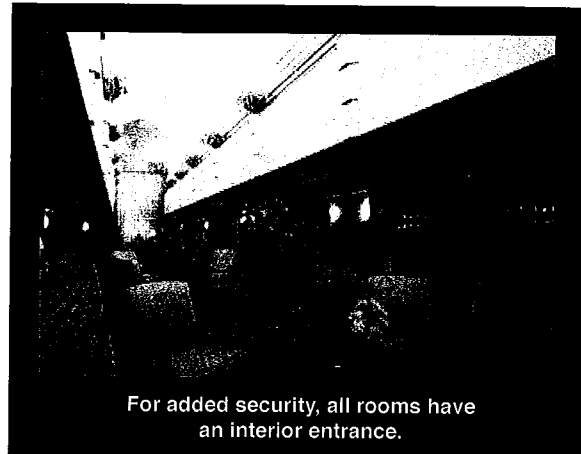

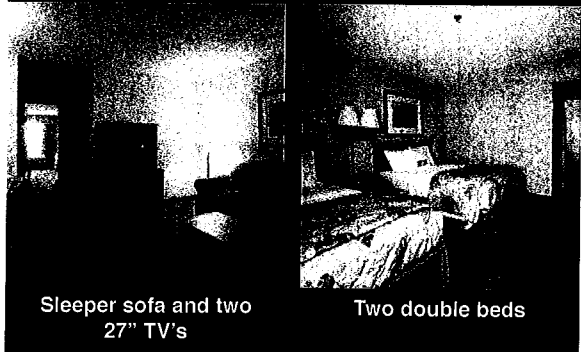

## QUESTIONS?

### JUNE 16-18 CAMP REGISTRATION & DEPARTURE

The registration for this camp will be from 5:30 - 6:15 p.m. on Friday with a departure at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday.

### INSURANCE

Campers must provide their own medical insurance. The camp has a professional medical trainer on duty at all times. A doctor is always on call minutes from the playing sites. The camp assumes no responsibility for accidents or illness.

### MULTIPLE FAMILY MEMBER DISCOUNT

If more than one family member attends any camp session, that boy or girl will receive a one-time reduced maximum \$25 discount if they are registered by April 1.

### HOTEL DISCOUNT FOR PARENTS

If parents would like to reserve a room for either one of two nights during the camp, they can contact Sarah at (920) 734-7777. Their son or daughter could also stay with them at one of the day camper prices listed on the application.

### CANCELLATIONS

All cancellations are subject to a service charge of \$25 after April 30.

### PERSONAL EQUIPMENT AND HEALTH FORM

Upon sending in the detached application form, the camp office will send you a list of things to bring with you. We will also send you a health form that must be signed by parents and brought with you on registration.

Please do not send this form in before the registration day.

### KEYS AND RESIDENCE PLAN

Keys will be given to the campers for the security of their room. Campers will be assigned to either two, three or four to a room and will be supervised by my staff. (All rooms at the La Quinta are smoke free.)

# HOW DO I GET THERE?

## APPLETON LAQUINTA SUITES

Appleton is located in the heart of the Fox River Valley, 30 miles south of Green Bay, 100 miles north of Milwaukee and 100 miles northeast of Madison.

The campers will be housed at the LaQuinta Suites that feature an indoor pool. The campers will have access to Funset Boulevard, a family entertainment center, which is about 50 yards north of the hotel.

The basketball facilities are listed under "EXCELLENT CAMP FACILITIES" in the brochure. The campers will be school bused to the Appleton Downtown YMCA, which takes about 10 minutes for each trip.

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## APPLETON DOWNTOWN YMCA

From US Highway 41, take exit 137 onto College Avenue past the La Quinta Suites. You will be going east on College Avenue. Turn right on S. Durkee Street and then another right onto E. Lawrence Street. (The total distance after you turn onto College Avenue to the YMCA is three miles) NOTE: Parking is available in the ramp west of the YMCA on the corner of Morrison St. and E. Lawrence St. at \$2.00 per three hours or on the streets near the YMCA.

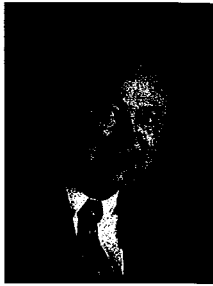

Don Gosz was a head coach at the high school level in Wisconsin for 25 years and also was an assistant coach at the University of Wisconsin-Madison for two years. The highlight of his coaching career was at Whitefish Bay Dominican High School when his teams won 71 consecutive games and two WISAA state championships.

He was inducted into the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Hall of Fame in 1981.

Coach Gosz is presently the dean of Wisconsin summer basketball camp directors, having served in that capacity for 51 consecutive years.

## A NOTE FROM DON GOSZ

"Our June 17th Shooting and Offensive Skills Camps will spend two sessions on strictly shooting skills, drills, and techniques on Friday evening and Saturday morning. The Saturday afternoon and evening sessions will emphasize various passing, dribbling, and position breakdown drills in fundamentals, lines and group breakdown drills with the individual's assigned coach. Sunday's activities will include review work and contest finals, followed by a short awards program.

We will try to build in some time for various contests. 25 rooms have been reserved in the LaQuinta SUITES that feature separate sitting and sleeping areas, two 27" TV's in each room, sleeper sofa, microwave, and refrigerator.

No other camp that I am familiar with can match these lodging facilities!

## ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

WIAA DIVISION 1 STATE CHAMPION COACH IN 1991, 1995, 2003 & 2004 RUNNER-UP IN 1992, 1994, and 2012.



Jim Gosz will begin his 30th year as an associate director. In his 26 years at Milwaukee King, the Generals have amassed a sparkling 526-104 record, winning four WIAA Division 1 state championships and placing second on three other occasions. During that time, King captured 12 Milwaukee City Conference championships and had a 52 game conference winning streak. In addition, 21 players have gone on to play at the Division 1 or 2 level and one in the NBA.

The Milwaukee Journal Sentinel named him their area "Coach of the Year" in 1995 and again in 2003.

King finished the 2003 and 2004 seasons ranked by "USA Today" among the top 25 high schools in the nation. The Generals were ranked as high as #4 in 2004 by that publication.

In 2008 Jim was selected head coach of the McDonald's High School All-American boys' basketball team, and in 2009 was the head coach for the USA Global Midwest Challenge team in Portland, Oregon.

## ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

Mike Gosz will begin his 24th year as an associate director.

He was the head girls' coach at Sussex-Hamilton High School for 10 years. Prior to that, he served as the assistant head coach for the men's program and two years as an assistant for the UW-Whitewater men's program.

During his first year as girls' head coach at Sussex-Hamilton, his team qualified for the sectional tournament.

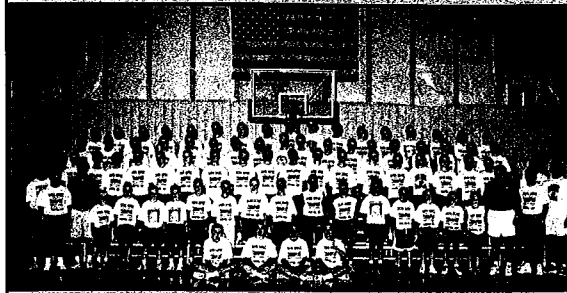
He was chosen as an assistant coach for the WBCA All-Star games in 1999. Presently, he is a member of the WIAA Advisory Council. Mike was chosen the 2014-15 Wisconsin Association of School Councils (WASC) Senior High School State Administrator of the Year.

Mike's video, "Fundamentals First", produced in 2005, is a two hour film featuring many INDIVIDUAL ball handling, dribbling, shooting, low post and perimeter moves and some team/group passing, pivoting and shooting drills. These skills are so necessary in the development of a young basketball player and also for a person interested in coaching young players.

Mike will again coordinate the shooting part of our camp. Over 1,000 campers have attended this type of camp.
